

Ubercart Installation Cheat Sheet

Server Recommendations*

Apache web server on Linux with PHP5, memory limit \geq 24 MB, and MySQL 5.0 or higher.

**While you may be able to successfully use Drupal and Ubercart that do not meet these recommendations, you may run into individual module compatibility issues (particularly if using older versions of PHP or MySQL).*

Warning: Migrating from or replacing Drupal e-commerce.

Installing Ubercart on a site on which you have previously installed the old Drupal e-commerce package will result in problems due to the package's incomplete installation features. You can perform a manually uninstallation if you must, but you are advised to start from a clean slate. Refer to <http://www.ubercart.org/faq/475>.

Installation Steps

1. Install Drupal.

Install the latest version of Drupal on which Ubercart can run, currently 5.7. For help, refer to the instructions at http://www.ubercart.org/docs/user/3312/installing_drupal.

2. Install Ubercart dependencies.*

****Ubercart will automatically configure image support for products and catalog categories if it finds these modules when you install the Ubercart product and catalog modules.*

3. Install core Ubercart modules.

Before installing any other Ubercart modules, install the Cart, Order, Product, and Store modules. If you don't need shopping cart or order placement functionality, you can leave those modules disabled.

4. Install extra Ubercart modules.

Ubercart comes with a number of modules to add common features to your store, including taxes, payments, shipping, file downloads, and more. Review the list and enable the modules required to meet your needs. If you aren't sure, search Ubercart.org for solutions to common specifications or post your question in the forums if you can't find anything.
